Carol Service

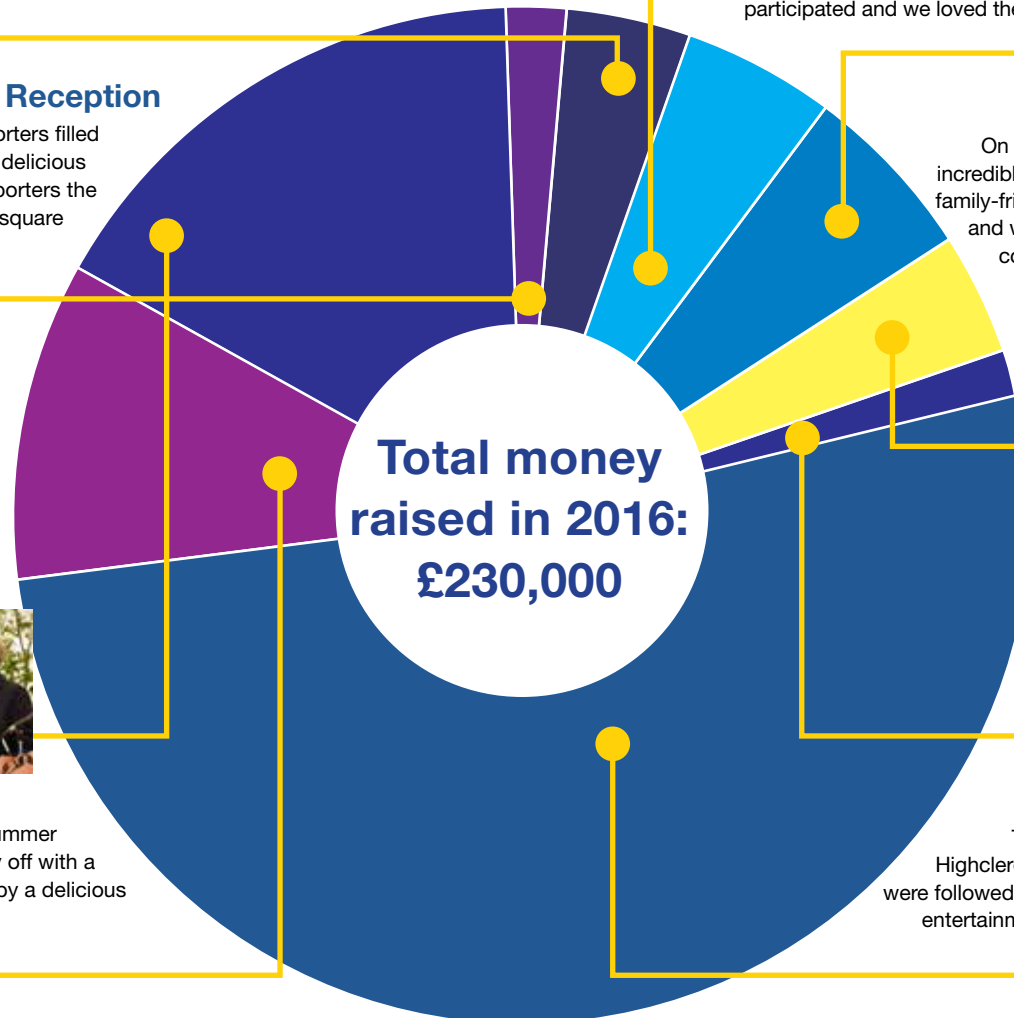

Our highlights from 2016

What we bought

Shear Wave Ultrasound Radiology Department

This is a Shear Wave ultrasound probe that enables patients with suspected liver fibrosis to have a simple ultrasound scan to safely assess and/or confirm diagnosis. The Shear Wave ultrasound probe is designed to attach to one of the existing modern ultrasound machines.

C-MAC Videolaryngoscope Intensive Care Unit

A laryngoscope is a medical instrument used by an anaesthetist or intensive care doctor to visualise a patient's airway and facilitates intubation. The C-MAC videolaryngoscope produces a real-time video image of the airway that may be viewed by the operator and other members of the team at the same time.

Plus OPTix Auto Refractor Orthoptic Department

The Plus OPTix Auto Refractor reads children's glasses prescription in 2-3 seconds. There are so many benefits that this piece of equipment has already brought to our hospital and it even means that the child doesn't have to have stinging dilating drops in the eyes, as the equipment doesn't require drops to work. Orthoptists can now completely manage the patient in one visit with this new piece of equipment, and the time spent in hospital for children and parents will be dramatically reduced: orthoptic clinics take 20 minutes, where as a doctor/orthoptic appointment can take 2-3 hours.

MOTomed Critical Care Leg/Arm Pedals Physiotherapy Department



MOTomed Leg/Arm pedals are a revolutionary motor-driven and software-controlled bed trainer for gentle movement therapy. The legs can be moved passively, motor-assisted or active resisted. It allows patients in critical care to begin their exercise rehabilitation straight away.

SAFIRE Radiology Department

SAFIRE is a raw data-based Iterative Reconstruction technology that reduces noise on CT images and hence reduces patient dose. The direct benefit of this technology will be in patients' reduced radiation dose without reducing image quality.

The scanner, which has now been added to this technology, is also set up to carry out Colongraphy CT scans used for bowel cancer screening.

Central Foetal Monitoring System Maternity Department

A Central Foetal Monitoring System was installed for foetal monitoring traces whereby real-time traces are 'streamed', to be viewed by senior decision makers who are based in central locations on the labour ward, at the hospital site or at home through remote access when on call.

Biopsies and Diagnostic Equipment Gynaecology Department

This additional equipment has increased the usage of the existing kit to allow for the possibility of targeted biopsy during an out patients procedure, saving the patient having to return to the hospital for another visit and resulting in less costs to the NHS.

Training Defibrillator

Immediate Life Support (ILS) is a mandatory annual study day for emergency department nurses. Places on ILS days are limited and staff often face a long wait for training despite the ED deemed to be a high priority. With the right equipment, ILS study days could be run in-house as required to ensure all staff maintain compliance and competence. The same is true of Paediatric life support courses that are also a mandatory annual requirement for ED staff.

iSimulate

Using just two iPads, the lightness and simplicity of ALSi makes it ideal for in-situ training, which provides facilitators with a great tool for training and learners an incredibly realistic platform to learn from. ALSi allows simulation and scenario-based education to be delivered quickly, easily and intuitively. It is a hyper-flexible patient monitor simulator which uses two iPads connected wirelessly. The system includes an AED, a sophisticated multi-parameter patient monitor and defibrillator that can all be simulated using the touch screen of an iPad.

For Gastroenterology

Spyglass-Digital Direct Visualisation

£65,000

The Department of Gastroenterology are asking the Medical Fund to purchase Spyglass, a digital direct visualisation system used when performing Endoscopic Retrograde Cholangio Pancreatography (ERCP). It provides additional clinical value to ERCP clinicians

through simple, direct visualisation of the pancreaticobiliary ductal system in situations where standard ERCP alone could be challenging, inefficient or ineffective.

It allows for digital imaging as opposed to standard fluoroscopy, which is two dimensional, black and white imaging that provides a more effective way to diagnose and treat pancreaticobiliary stricture and stones.

For Gynaecology

Mini Laparoscopy Instruments

This investment will enable our hospital to offer mini laparoscopic services. Mini laparoscopy uses 2mm-3mm mini instruments and ports instead of the 5mm and 10mm conventional ones. It reduces patients' post-operative pain, minimises the risk of post-operative hernia formation and improves the cosmetic result. This investment will improve the quality and range of services we offer to our population, attract more referrals and generate more income for our trust.

Ambulatory Urodynamics Machine

Ambulatory urodynamics involve the use of a small hand held device that the patient carries around with them. They can walk around and perform natural tasks that may trigger their symptoms (incontinence, urgency etc.). The patient can then press a button on the hand held device which records the event, and then after the test period (up to 3-4 hours) the device is returned and results are given. Benefits include more physiological bladder function seen during tests compared to conventional tests, and less false positive results seen during conventional urodynamics.

For Maternity

Three Obstetric Ultrasound Machines

Three top of the range ultrasound machines, including 3D and 4D probes, for maternity departments in Basingstoke, Winchester and Andover. These machines enable the sonographer to have a 4D view of the baby and also undertake the required extra three cardiac views (set by Public Health England last year). It will also enable better detection of abnormalities, which leads to more timely action being taken to try to combat these.

Endobronchial Ultrasound Scope

We recently purchased an Endobronchial Ultrasound with one bronchoscope for £109,000 for more effective treatment of lung cancer. Purchasing an additional scope will reduce the risk of running a service with one bronchoscope, particularly if the device fails to operate during a procedure. If used weekly, the equipment could treat up to 150 patients annually.

For Radiology

£51,091

Interventional Radiology Ultrasound Machine

A new ultrasound machine with highly advanced software packages to undertake state-of-the-art procedures. This will benefit the department by allowing physicians to treat previously untreatable patients, with safer and more accurate treatment whilst reducing pressure on CT waiting lists. With this machine, it means that physicians can treat tumours that cannot be seen on CT scans or MRI scans.

For Ophthalmology

Ultra-widefield Fundus Camera

This machine will be a very significant upgrade on the existing fundus camera, which is now out of date and rarely used. It allows an ultra-widefield (UWF) view of the retina in a single picture through un-dilated pupils. A 200 degree field of view of the retina is visible, which is up to 82% of the retina in a single photo compared to the existing camera's 30 degree field of view, which also requires the use of dilating eye drops.

The device will also allow us to perform diagnostic imaging such as UWF fluorescein and indocyanine green angiography to image retinal and choroidal blood flow. The accompanying software allows image manipulation to aid diagnosis. Images may be viewed on eight PCs simultaneously so that many staff members may work at the same time.

Micropulse Yellow Wavelength Retinal Laser

Yellow wavelength lasers are a new development in the treatment of retinal diseases, and hold many advantages over the traditional green wavelength lasers used in the majority of eye units in the UK. They penetrate the tissues of the eye, including through cataracts, to where they are effective at the retina. This wavelength laser works therapeutically on the retinal tissues, but critically does not cause as much damage as green lasers.

The direct benefit of the technology will be to significantly reduce radiation dose to patients without reducing image quality. The scanner, which has been added to this technology, performs several thousand CT scans per year and is also set up to carry out CT Colonography scans for bowel cancer screening."

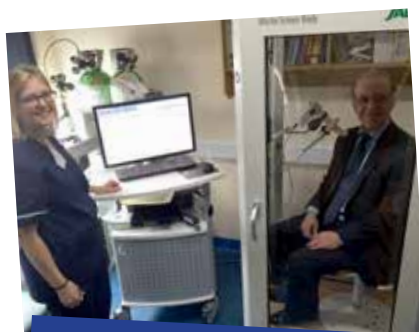
