Over £450,000 raised for medical equipment in 2017



2017 was one of the best ever for the Medical Fund. We spent £458K on 10 pieces of equipment, ranging in price from £4k to £93K.

In addition we added 84 new 200 Club members, taking

us to 335, and nine new 500 Business Club members joined, taking the total to 17. Could I possibly ask for your help once again to find another 50 new members?

We held 13 events, half of which were new and all were successful. Two were entirely due to the generosity of the Balding family – the evening at Parkhouse Stables was very well attended and a huge success, as was the Cross Country Ride. We will be in their magnificent marquee again on Saturday 28th July, with a panel of high-profile racing and sporting personnel being interviewed. These events are made possible by many people giving up their valuable time and I thank them all very much for their energy, enthusiasm and generosity. We also had a very successful year with our applications to Charitable Trusts, nearly half our income came from these.

Sadly Judith left us in January to pursue pastures new; she did a wonderful job as our Fund Manager, and has left us with a really great team who continue to carry on our important work.

Our highlights from 2017

Our events from 2017 contributed to 37% of our total amount raised. The other 63% was made up from general donations, charitable trusts, legacies/in memory donations, 200 and 500 Club membership, sponsored events, community collections and recovery of Gift Aid.

Events

Bridge Teas – £3,541

Following the success of our first Bridge afternoon at Ashe Park last Spring, we held another last Autumn in Baughurst. There was a delightful afternoon tea to enjoy and a raffle whilst supporters played bridge.

Set in the most beautiful of locations – Bere Mill on the banks of the treasured Test at Whitchurch – the festival was a perfect day out for families and friends, promoting the fun of the great outdoors and all it has to offer. Private View of the Mary Rose Museum & Dinner on HMS Victory - £13,419

Drinks and canapés were served to supporters as they wandered around the prestigious Mary Rose Museum before sitting down to a delicious three course dinner on HMS Victory.

Drinks and a Private View of Park House Stables - £21,032

Last Summer, the Balding Family kindly hosted a private view of Park House Stables. Afternoon Tea was served before guests watched a parade of the horses followed by a tour of the stables. Drinks and canapés were served in the evening during an auction.

London South Tough Mudder Half – £3,847

Sixteen supporters participated in an endurance event series of five miles of mud and 13 challenging obstacles to support the North Hampshire Medical Fund. The team used all the energy they had and completed the course covered from head to toe in mud – they are truly inspirational!

Cycle Sportive - £9,823

We held our second Cycle Sportive last September, starting at Inhurst Farm in Baughurst. Two-hundred riders attended and chose to ride 12, 40 or 80 miles. On their return, they were awarded a shiny medal, a hog roast, and magnificent coffee from CaféPod to refuel.

Pop Up Charity Shop, Whitchurch – £1,281

We were lucky enough to receive an abundance of donations of designer and quality high street clothing and accessories last year, which we sold for a week in October at Rotations Charity Shop in Whitchurch.

Wine Dinner at Highclere Stud – £70,802

A fabulous wine dinner was held at Highclere Stud, and with the generous pledges of our supporters, successfully raised enough money to buy new technology to help treat cancer of the liver. There was live music from the Troubadours and the wines were presented by David Roberts MW, one of 354 Masters of Wine in the world.

Cross Country Fun Ride – £7,419

Our first ever Cross Country Fun Ride was a tremendous success with a turnout of over 300 riders. This was a very special event as competitors were able to ride across the beautiful Watership Down and adjoining farm land as well as the Lloyd Webber's Estate.

Our highlights from 2017

What we bought

iSimulate for A&E - £10,020

The lightness and simplicity of ALSi makes it ideal for in-situ training. ALSi allows simulation and scenario-based education with an incredibly realistic platform to be delivered quickly, easily and intuitively. It is a hyper-flexible patient monitor simulator which uses two iPads connected wirelessly. The system includes an AED, a sophisticated multi-parameter patient monitor and defibrillator that can all be simulated using an iPad.

MyoMaps Software for MRI Scanner for Hepatology - £45,136

This software will be used by two departments. In cardiology, it allows more detailed non-invasive cardiac assessment, and in liver surgery it will allow the Trust to take part in HepaT1ca, a research project. This is looking at the ability of liver MRI to predict liver health in a non-invasive fashion, to allow a more accurate preoperative assessment of the individual patient & ultimately reduce the risk of liver surgery.

Training Defibrillator for A&E - £3,999

Immediate Life Support (ILS) is a mandatory annual study day for emergency department nurses. Places on ILS days are limited and staff often face a long wait for training. With the right equipment, ILS study days could be run in-house to ensure all staff maintain compliance and competence. The same is true of Paediatric life support courses that are also a mandatory annual requirement for ED staff.

Mini Laparoscopy Instruments for Gynaecology - £26,148

Mini laparoscopy uses 2mm-3mm mini instruments and ports instead of the conventional 5mm and 10mm, which enable our hospital to offer mini laparoscopic services. It reduces post-operative pain, minimises the risk of hernia formation and improves the cosmetic result. It will improve the quality and range of services offered, attracting more referrals and more income for our trust.

Ambulatory Urodynamics Machine for Gynaecology - £10,300

Ambulatory urodynamics uses a small hand held device. For a test period, the patient with symptoms including incontinence, urgency etc. can continue normal activities while easily recording any events that occur. The device is proven to include more physiological bladder function and reduce false positive results seen during conventional urodynamics.

Total equipment bought in 2017: £458,000

Three Obstetric Ultrasound Machines for Maternity - £116,671

Three top of the range ultrasound machines, including 3D and 4D probes, were purchased for Basingstoke, Winchester and Andover. The sonographer can have a 4D view of the baby and also undertake the required extra three cardiac views (set by Public Health England). It also enables better detection of abnormalities, allowing for more timely action to combat these.

Endobronchial Ultrasound Scope for Respiratory - £46,710

We purchased an Endobronchial Ultrasound with one bronchoscope in 2015 for more effective treatment of lung cancer. We've now purchased an additional scope to reduce the risk of running a service with only one bronchoscope, particularly if the device fails to operate during a procedure.

Interventional Radiology Ultrasound Machine for Radiology - £48,425

A new ultrasound machine with highly advanced software packages to undertake state-of-the-art procedures. This benefits the department by allowing physicians to treat previously untreatable patients, with safer and more accurate treatment whilst reducing pressure on CT waiting lists. With this machine, it means that physicians can treat tumours that cannot be seen on CT scans or MRI scans.

Ultra-widefield Fundus Camera for Ophthalmology - £84,879

This is a significant upgrade on the existing camera, allowing an ultra-widefield view of the retina in a single picture. A 200° field of view of the retina is visible, without dilating eye drops, which is up to 82% of the retina in a single photo compared to the existing camera's 30° field of view. It also allows complex diagnostic imaging, while the accompanying software allows image manipulation to aid diagnosis. Images may be viewed on eight PCs simultaneously so that staff may work at the same time.

Micropulse Yellow Wavelength Retinal Laser for Ophthalmology - £65,995

Yellow wavelength lasers are a new development in the treatment of retinal diseases, and hold many advantages over the traditional green wavelength lasers used in the majority of eye units in the UK. They penetrate the tissues of the eye, including through cataracts, to where they are effective at the retina. This wavelength laser works therapeutically on the retinal tissues, but critically does not cause as much damage as green lasers.

For Gynaecology, Urogynaecology General **Surgery and Urology**

State-of-the-art Laparoscopic Simulator and Mobile Camera/Monitor System

There is nothing like this in the UK. Current simulators have significant limitations. This is state-of-the-art, innovative and the future answer to training surgeons in laparoscopic surgery. This equipment allows the surgeon to perform parts of an operation and then rest if fatigued. It allows the surgeon to perform the same tasks over and over again, improving fine motor skills. It allows the surgeon to make mistakes, learn from their mistakes and then continue without causing any damage to a patient.



For Critical Care Point-of-Care Ultrasound

The Point-of-Care Ultrasound has unique software capabilities that allow non-invasive assessment of the function of the heart over time, allowing treatments to be tailored to the individual patient's response. It will enable Basingstoke Hospital to lead the region in its intensive care ultrasound capabilities and attract trainees who increasingly wish to add ultrasound to their skill-mix

For Child Health Newborn Screening Hearing Equipment

There are two stages for the hearing pathway which traditionally has involved

two different pieces of equipment being used. Some of the machines at Basingstoke Hospital are now 12+ years old and require replacement. New technology means that both hearing tests can be undertaken using a single machine. Using a single machine is beneficial to the baby (reduced examination time) and to the operator (reduced patient data entry error).

For Radiology Nuclear Medicine SPECT/CT

The sole gamma camera at Basingstoke Hospital uses technology that is obsolete with a limited range of

examinations. At seven years older than the expected lifespan, this service will cease completely if not replaced. This will be catastrophic for many services and there will be a significant financial impact as patients will be sent to other organisations.

A SPECT/CT incorporates a gamma camera with a CT scanner (low dose CT tube). These two types of scans are fused together to give a 3D image. The anatomy as well as the functionality of body systems can be studied, offering increased sensitivity and anomaly detection for a more accurate and detailed diagnosis.

For Urology Mini-Nephroscope Set



A Mini-Nephroscope is used to perform percutaneous nephrolitotomy (PCNL) for large kidney stones. This advanced scope will improve comfort to patients as it is narrower than the current kit used in main theatre and there will be reduced blood loss during the procedure. It will also improve image quality so it is easier for the surgeon to operate the scope and view the kidney and stone location. Another benefit is that a shorter hospital stay post-operatively is required (median one day versus three days). The equipment will be used at both Basingstoke & North Hampshire Hospital and Royal Hampshire County Hospital.

For the Lung Function Laboratory **Transcutaneous CO2 Monitor**

The transcutaneous carbon dioxide monitor allows continuous non-invasive measurement of oxygen and carbon dioxide levels for long periods of time, negating the need for repeated invasive blood gases. It is a heated sensor which attaches to the patients ear and measures the blood gases through diffusion. This piece of equipment will also monitor patients' blood gases during sleep to see whether ventilator settings and oxygen titration is set at an



optimum level, allowing patients to go home quicker with non-invasive ventilation (NIV). This will allow the patient to be managed remotely, from home, requiring less hospital visits.

For Breast Surgery

Cytori Celbrush

Lipomodelling (fat transfer/lipofilling) represents an excellent option for

revising scars and cosmetic defects, improving symmetry and maximising patient satisfaction and guality of life. Increasingly, we will begin to offer fat transfer of larger volumes, potentially even for whole breast reconstruction. The process is time-consuming by nature; however equipment such as the BodyJet system aims to reduce this. The Cytori Celbrush is a re-usable, autoclavable stainless steel surgical instrument, which enables the precise delivery of micro-droplets when fat cells are injected during lipomodelling.

Intrabeam Intraoperative Radiotherapy

£45.000 Intraoperative radiotherapy (IORT) is where the patient is given a single dose of radiotherapy during their operation for breast cancer. This negates the need for a 3-5 week course of radiotherapy treatment post-operation for suitable patients. The Intrabeam is cutting edge technology; Hampshire Hospitals Foundation Trust will be one of only two district hospitals in the UK able to offer intra-operative radiotherapy and intra-operative sentinel node analysis (OSNA) simultaneously: effectively this is one-stop surgery and radiotherapy, as a day case procedure.



Professor Christian Phillips, head of the Pelvic Floor Centre at Hampshire Hospitals Foundation Trust has said: "We would like to say a big thank you to the North Hampshire Medical Fund for raising the money to purchase this 'state-of-the-art' Ambulatory Urodynamics Equipment. This small portable device, which is the same size as a mobile phone,

can allow women to have complex bladder function tests performed whist they go about their usual activities. Previously these tests could only be performed by equipment the size of a washing machine!

We are the only hospital in the south outside of London to be able to provide this service, which will hugely benefit our patients and those referred from other hospitals to our tertiary centre. Without the help of the Medical Fund, this would not have been possible."
